andscape Plants for the Arizona Desert

Fall Color Combinations

By fall, many plants need a rest. However, look for these fall bloomers to carry your landscape into the winter months with a splash of color.

- Autumn Sage (*Salvia greggii*) & Mt. Lemmon Marigold (*Tagetes palmeri*) These two fall-blooming, desert shrubs make a dazzling combination, with the red to magenta flowers of Autumn Sage in marked contrast to the intense yellow flowers of Mt. Lemmon Marigold. This is also an excellent rabbit-resistant combination.
- Hummingbird Trumpet (*Zauschneria californica*) & Prairie Zinnia (*Zinnia grandiflora*) A late summer and early fall, Arizona native, perennial and groundcover combination. The iridescent red flowers of Hummingbird Trumpet stand out in contrast with the yellow flowers of ground-covering Prairie Zinnia.
- Mexican Bird of Paradise (*Caesalpinia mexicana*) & Pink Muhly (*Muhlenbergia capillaris*) The brilliant yellow flowers of the shrubby to treelike Mexican Bird of Paradise provide the dramatic background for the burgundy-red flower display of Pink Muhly.
- Black Dalea (*Dalea frutescens*) & Turpentine Bush (*Ericameria laricifolia*) The brilliant reddish-violet flowers of Black Dalea provide stunning contrast to the yellow flowers of Turpentine Bush.

- Cape Honeysuckle (*Tecomaria capensis*) & Turpentine Bush (*Ericameria laricifolia*) The glossy green leaves and bright orange flowers of this South African shrub combine beautifully with the yellow flowers and dark green foliage of Turpentine Bush.
- Pink Trumpet Vine (*Podranea ricasoliana*) & Mexican Bird of Paradise (*Caesalpinia mexicana*) The glossy green leaves and lavender-pink flowers of this South African, sprawling vine contrast beautifully with the bright yellow flower clusters of the Mexican Bird of Paradise.
- Pink Muhly (*Muhlenberiga capillaris*) & Pink Trumpet Vine (*Podranea ricasoliana*) Combine these two for an amazing fall display. The burgundy-red flower spikes of the Pink Muhly will provide a blended accent to the lavender-pink flowers of the Pink Trumpet Vine.
- Thunder Cloud Sage (*Leucophyllum candidum*) & Yellow Dot (*Wedelia trilobata*) The stunning silvery-gray foliage and intense purple blooms of Thunder Cloud Sage provide the perfect contrast to the bright green foliage and small yellow flowers of Yellow Dot.
