The program educates industry professionals through the various courses which are taught by local industry experts, academics, and practitioners.

The <u>benefits of the Smartscape Program</u> can be seen on all sides. Participating in the program empowers landscape and irrigation professionals to build skills that will increase landscape water use efficiency, allowing them to distinguish themselves from their competition, provide their customers with quality service, and take personal responsibility for a resource critical to the industry. It also helps landscape and irrigation professionals stay up to date on the latest industry trends, research, and practices while networking and learning about marketing opportunities.

In addition to the benefits to the professionals, residents and business owners are not only better educated on the positive impact a low water use yard can have. It also helps residents understand how important it is to <u>hire the right person</u> to help you design, install, and maintain your landscape and ensure your irrigation system is running as efficiently as possible. As in any profession, not all landscape service providers are equal. The landscape professionals you select to assist you should be trusted partners who provide expert advice, guidance, and services to help bring your outdoor living space to life.
